Cambridge Overview

A City of History

Cambridge was settled in 1630 by a group from the Massachusetts Bay Company. Originally called “Newtowne,” it was incorporated as a town in 1636 and became a city in 1846 by uniting the three villages of Old Cambridge, Cambridgeport and East Cambridge. The name “Cambridge” was selected by the General Court because many of the men had attended Cambridge University in England and thought it would be an appropriate name for a college town in New England.

Cambridge Common has been the site of political, religious and social historic events for nearly 350 years. Freedom of speech was declared at the site in 1637, freedom of religion in 1740, and George Washington took command of the First Continental Army in 1775 on Cambridge Common. Poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow’s house is still located on Brattle Street, and more presidents and Nobel laureates have lived in Cambridge than any other city. Cambridge is a city firmly rooted in the past, with an eye on the future.

A City of Innovation

The birthplace of the Internet, the first instant photograph, and the chemical synthesis of penicillin, Cambridge’s evolution is filled with innovation. Enthusiasm of entrepreneurs has led to advances in key high tech and life sciences industries, many of them generated by MIT and Harvard graduates. Furniture and glass factories, Cambridge’s major industries in the 19th and early 20th centuries, have been replaced with technology-based enterprises such as electronics, software and biotechnology research. Discoveries are made every day in the labs of Cambridge’s life sciences companies. Cambridge is also home to globally-known leaders in business consulting, architectural design, environmental engineering, telecommunications and medical equipment.

A City of Education

Cambridge has long been called the “Intellectual Capital of the World.” Harvard University, America’s first institution of higher learning, was founded in Cambridge in 1636. Cambridge is also home to the renowned Massachusetts Institute of Technology and other institutions of higher learning including Lesley University and Cambridge College. Nearly one-quarter of the City’s residents are students and the universities employ one in six people in Cambridge. An educated populace with excellent choices in both public and private education, more than 85 percent of residents have graduated from high school and more than 45 percent have a college degree, providing a skilled work force for businesses of every variety and fostering the entrepreneurial spirit for which Cambridge is known.

A City of Diversity

More than one in five Cambridge residents were born in another country. Haiti, Central America and Portuguese-speaking countries, including Brazil, are the most widely represented in Cambridge. Nearly 60 languages are spoken in the public schools. The city itself encompasses fifteen distinct neighborhoods. Most have their own political and civic organizations and a distinct personality.

A City of Culture

With over 250 restaurants, many featuring award-winning chefs; a dozen art and science museums; street fairs, festivals and farmers markets; there is always something to do in Cambridge. Admire the City’s distinctive architecture, browse in the many bookstores, enjoy an exhibit or lecture presented by one of the universities, or take in a performance at one of Cambridge’s historical theatres.

Moving to and Living in Cambridge

Emergencies

Dial 911 for crimes in progress, life threatening situations, fires, motor vehicle accidents or major traffic and street obstructions, injuries requiring emergency medical attention, hazardous chemical spills, fire, smoke detector or carbon monoxide alarms that are sounding, sparking electrical hazards, smoke in a building or any other emergency.

Police/Fire Non-Emergencies

Call the Police Switchboard at (617) 349-3300 to locate a towed vehicle, report a blocked driveway or hydrant, report a major noise complaint, or for other non-emergency situations. The Fire Department can be reached at (617) 349-4900 and the Police Department business number is (617) 349-3301.

Telephone Service

Ten-digit dialing is required to make phone calls in Massachusetts. You must dial the area code for all calls, local or long-distance. You do not need to dial a 1 before the area code to make a call within the area code from which you are calling. Most Cambridge numbers are in the 617 area code. 857 is an overlay area code.

Electric and Gas Service

To establish electrical or gas service, call NSTAR at (800) 592-2000 or visit <http://www.nstaronline.com>.

Cable Television

For Cable TV service, call Comcast at (800) COMCAST, view their Web site at <http://www.comcast-ne.com> or visit their local service center at 88 Sherman Street, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. or Saturday 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Comcast also offers high-speed Internet access and digital voice services.

Apartment Rentals

Rental rates and availability fluctuate widely. The best way to locate housing opportunities and find out about individual neighborhoods is usually through a registered real estate agent (see page 8). Rentals are also listed in the newspapers and Web sites such as <http://www.boston.com>.

Television

The CBS affiliate in Boston is WBZ-TV, Channel 4; the ABC affiliate is WCVB-TV, Channel 5; the NBC affiliate is WHDH-TV, Channel 7; the CW affiliate is WLVI, Channel 56; and the FOX affiliate is Channel 25. WGBH-TV, Public Television, is on Channel 2. CCTV (Cambridge Community Television), located in Central Square, provides three community access channels as well as education, training and electronic media equipment. CCTV can be reached at (617) 661-6900.

Newspapers

Two Boston daily newspapers serve the Cambridge area, the *Boston Globe*, (888) MY-GLOBE or (617) 929-2000, and *Boston Herald*, (800) 882-1211 or (617) 426-3000. In addition, there is a free daily called *Metro*. Call (800) 982-4023 or visit <http://www.townonline> to subscribe to Cambridge's two weekly newspapers, the *Cambridge Chronicle* and *Cambridge TAB*. Many other weeklies, magazines and specialty publications are also available that are targeted to the area.

Public Library

The Main branch of the Cambridge Public Library is temporarily located at the Longfellow School at 359 Broadway, while a new library building is being constructed. The phone number is (617) 349-4030. There are also six additional neighborhood branches. Cambridge residents may obtain a library card by presenting two forms of identification that show name and local address. There is no waiting period for a library card. Your library card will grant you access to any library in the Minuteman Network, <http://www.mln.lib.ma.us/>. Library information and an on-line catalog are available at <http://www.cambridgema.gov/~CPL>.

Post Office

The main post office in Cambridge is located in Central Square at 770 Massachusetts Avenue. Window hours are Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 6:45 p.m. and Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. There are additional post office locations in Harvard Square, Porter Square, Kendall Square, Inman Square, East Cambridge, and at MIT, as well as a contract station at Huron Drug Store. Registering a Child in School (See page 12 for more information)

The Cambridge Public School system is currently made up of 12 elementary schools and one high school. Total enrollment in the school system is approximately 6,000 students with over 700 teachers, and 450 support personnel. Visit <http://www.cpsd.us> for more information.

The staff at the Cambridge Family Resource Center (CFRS) at 459 Broadway (inside Cambridge Rindge & Latin), (617) 349-6551, will provide information about school choices and help families complete registration forms. Children may be registered at any time after proof of residency can be provided. A birth certificate or passport, immunization records, and proof of residency are required.

Senior Services

Cambridge's Citywide Senior Center in Central Square offers activities and services for Cambridge's seniors. It is located at 806 Massachusetts Avenue and can be reached at (617) 349-6060. Somerville-Cambridge Elder Services can be reached at (617) 628-2601 or visit their Web site at <http://www.eldercare.org>.

Trash

Trash is picked-up curbside on a weekly basis. You can view a map of trash collection routes at <http://www.cambridgema.gov/TheWorks> or call the Department of Public Works Sanitation Department at (617) 349-4800 to find out what day your trash will be collected.

Recycling

Recyclables are picked-up curbside weekly on the same day that trash is collected. Paper must be bundled with a string or in a paper bag. Plastic, foil, cans and glass containers should be placed loose in a blue recycling bin, which can be obtained by calling (617) 349-4800. The Cambridge Recycling Drop-off Center accepts additional items. The Recycling Drop-off Center is located at 147 Hampshire Street, near Inman Square. Call (617) 349-4005 for recorded information about items being accepted or visit <http://www.cambridgema.gov/TheWorks>.

Driving

The principle routes through Cambridge are State Routes 2 (Memorial Drive/Alewife Brook Parkway), 2A (Massachusetts Avenue), 16 (Fresh Pond Parkway), and 28 (Msgr. O'Brien Highway). There is a Cambridge exit off of Interstate 93. The Massachusetts Turnpike runs just south of Cambridge and is accessible at the Allston/Brighton interchange.

SmarTraveler provides real-time, route-specific traffic reports. The phone number is *1 on a wireless phone or (617) 374-1234. You can also visit <http://www.smartraveler.com>.

Obtaining a License and Registering a Vehicle

Vehicle registration is mandatory within 30 days of establishing residency in Massachusetts. The first step is to get an insurance policy from an insurance agent, then contact the Registry of Motor Vehicles at (800) 858-3926 or visit <http://www.massrmv.com>. If your out-of-state license is current or expired less than one year, you can transfer it without having to be re-tested. Identification and proof of residency are required. The nearest full-service Registry offices are the Watertown branch at the Watertown Mall, 550 Arsenal Street, and the Boston branch at 630 Washington Street. There is also an express branch at the CambridgeSide Galleria that offers limited services. An inspection sticker must be obtained within seven days of registering a car. Find an inspection station at <http://vehicletest.state.ma.us/testinginfo.html>.

Parking Sticker

A resident parking permit is required to park on most residential streets in Cambridge Monday through Saturday. Apply for a resident parking sticker at the Traffic, Parking & Transportation Department. Call (617) 349-4700 or visit <http://www.cambridgema.gov/Traffic/> for hours and location. You must be a resident of Cambridge whose vehicle, weighing less than 2.5 tons, is registered with the Registry of Motor Vehicles as principally garaged in Cambridge at your residential address. You must present a current gas, electric, telephone or cable bill dated for service at your residence within 30 days as proof of residency. The bill must be in the same name as the automobile registration. The cost is \$8 per sticker per year. Each residential household can also obtain one visitor parking permit good in the area in which they live whether or not that household has a car. The cost is also \$8.

Public Transportation

Subway and bus service is operated by the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA). Call (617) 222-5000, (800) 392-6100 or visit <http://www.mbta.com> for information on routes, schedules and fares. Over 30 bus routes serve Cambridge. The Red Line is the primary subway, or "T," line servicing Cambridge. Stops include, from west to east, Alewife, Davis (in Somerville), Porter, Harvard, Central and Kendall/MIT. The Lechmere station on the green line is also located in Cambridge, near the CambridgeSide Galleria mall. Most T rides cost \$1.70 with a CharlieCard or \$2 with a CharlieTicket. Most buses cost \$1.25 with a CharlieCard or \$1.50 with a CharlieTicket/cash-on-board.

Building Permits

To obtain a building permit, contact the Building Office/Inspection Services at (617) 349-6100 or visit <http://www.cambridgema.gov/~Inspect/>.

Property Taxes

The residential tax rate in Cambridge is \$7.48/\$1000. The commercial rate is \$18.30/\$1000. For information regarding taxes, contact the Assessor's Office at City Hall, 795 Massachusetts Avenue, (617) 349-4343.

Registering a Business

To register a business, call the Cambridge City Clerk's office at (617) 349-4260 or apply in person at City Hall. To obtain a Tax ID number, call the Secretary of State's office at (617) 727-7030.

Voting

You must register 20 days prior to an election to be eligible to vote. You can register to vote in person at the Office of the Election Commission, 51 Inman Street, First Floor, if you are a US citizen, a resident of Massachusetts, and 18 years old on or before election day. The Commission office is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. You can also obtain a Mail-In Voter Registration form by calling (617) 722-2828 or (800) 462-VOTE. Additional mail-in forms are available at a number of locations including Cambridge branches of the Post Office, branches of the Cambridge Public Library, and City Hall. You can also register to vote at the Registry of Motor Vehicles when applying for a Massachusetts license.

The ward and precinct determines where residents vote and in which elective district citizens reside. The Commission staff informs voters of their ward, precinct and polling place at the time of registration in the office. When voters register by mail, an acknowledgment notice is sent indicating the ward, precinct and polling location. There are 42 polling locations throughout the city.

Parks/Recreational Facilities (see page 24 for more information)

Cambridge maintains numerous parks and playgrounds throughout the city, including tot lots, basketball courts, tennis courts, and athletic fields. Danehy Park is located at 99 Sherman Street. The fifty-acre park is open year-round and includes tot lots, bocce and horseshoe courts, picnic areas, and soccer and softball fields. Hours are 8 a.m. to dusk. Special events include a family and children's concert series, arts & crafts festivals and a kite festival.

The Gold Star pool, the only city-owned public outdoor swimming facility, is located at the corner of Berkshire & Cambridge Streets. Call (617) 349-6310 for more information. For indoor swimming, the War Memorial pool at Cambridge Rindge & Latin School is open to residents in the evenings and on the weekend. CALL (617) 349-6279.

The Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) operates several popular Cambridge recreation areas, including the Charles River Esplanade, Fresh Pond Parkway and Alewife Brook Reservation. Football and softball fields are available at Magazine Beach on Memorial Drive. The Magazine Beach Pool and McCrehan Memorial Pool at Alewife Brook Parkway and Rindge Avenue are operated by the DCR. For more information, visit <http://www.mass.gov/dcr/>.

Community Boating, the oldest and largest nonprofit sailing organization in the nation, offers boat rentals and sailing lessons on the Charles River. Visit <http://www.community-boating.org> or call (617) 523-1038.

Canoe and kayak rentals are available from Charles River Canoe and Kayak. Their Boston location is open Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays from May to October while the Newton location is open daily from April to November. Call (617) 965-5110 or visit <http://www.paddleboston.com>.

Cambridge is also home to the Head of the Charles Regatta, the world's largest two-day rowing event that draws competitors from all over the globe. This event is usually held the third weekend in October. Call (617) 868-6200 for dates and details.

Outdoor ice skating, including skate rentals, is available at Kendall Square Community Ice Skating. Visit <http://www.kendallsquare.org/skating/skating.php>. The Charles Hotel also offers a 2,900 square-foot outdoor skating rink open to the public, mid-December through February. Visit <http://www.charleshotel.com/iceskating.htm> or call (617)234-8008.

The Fresh Pond Golf Course, a public nine-hole course with pro shop, golf carts, snack bar and clubhouse is located at 691 Huron Avenue and can be reached at (617) 349-6282.

Numerous private and community health clubs offer a variety of indoor exercise and recreation options to keep residents in shape, including group exercise classes, free weights and exercise machines. Some clubs feature swimming pools, tennis and other racquet sports or climbing walls, as well as special services such as massage and aesthetician services.

Weather

The normal temperature in Cambridge in January is 28.6°F. In July it is 73.5°F. The normal annual precipitation is 41.5 inches. Call (617) 936-1234 for the current temperature and weather forecast.
